Expect much from us


Enable much by us

Welcome to the Table

Friends this meal does not belong to the church, but it is Christ's meal shared with those who were his friends, his followers, his doubters and betrayers, and we share this meal as Christ asked us to remember him.

So come you are welcome to receive the bread and wine this day.

Come you who have much faith, and you who doubt.

Come from across this nation and across the ditch. Come from the lands of First People's, from mountains and plains, fertile river flats and scrub land.

Come you who are excited about the future of the rural church and you who mourn the passing of what has been.

Come and taste the bread gathered in the paddocks we come from and drink the wine from the vineyards of our land.

Come and taste that the Lord is good and be sustained for the journey ahead, for it is not I that invites you; it is the risen Christ who invites us to meet him at this table.

Remembering the Story

Now let us hear the account of how this sacrament began

On the night on which Jesus was betrayed, he sat at supper with his disciples.

While they were eating, he took a piece of bread, said a blessing, broke it and gave it to them with the words;

This is my body.

It is broken for you.

Do this to remember me.

Later on he took a cup of wine, saying, "This wine is God's new covenant, sealed with my blood.

Drink from it all of you, to remember me".

Receiving the Story

- So, now following Jesus' example and command, we take this bread and this wine, the ordinary things of the world which Christ will make special. And as he said a prayer before sharing, let us do so too.

- Holy God, we give you thanks for all you are,

and for abiding ways down through the ages. For the creation; beauty and wonder drawn out of chaos.

- For your faithfulness to men, women and children, and for your yearning and speaking to people through word and sign.
- We give thanks for the announcement of your kingdom through Christ, and for his way of faithfulness, grace and love. For his life, his calling to humanity, his death and for the life he brings eternal, we give thanks.
- And now we thank you for this bread and wine, through which you feed our body and soul, for in its brokenness there is wholeness, in its simpleness there is abundance, and in this meal together, there is Christ.

Lord Jesus Christ,
As we do now what you did in an upstairs room,
Send down your Holy Spirit upon us
and upon these gifts of bread and wine
that they might become for us your body,
healing and forgiving
and making us whole
and that we may become for you,
your body, loving and caring in the world,
until your kingdom comes
Amen.
