Isaiah 35

What does flourishing mean?

- Miriam Webster: "Marked by vigorously, healthy growth; very active and successful;" synonyms – thriving, successful, prosperous
- Oxford language "developing rapidly and successfully, thriving
- Harvard Human Flourishing program: 5 domains of flourishing –
- Happiness and life satisfaction; mental and physical health; meaning and purpose; character and virtue; close social relationships

Martin Seligman – U. of Pennsylvania

- P positive emotions increase positive emotions through gratitude, forgiveness, build hope and optimism
- E engagement fully develop skill and strengths to challenging task, being "in the flow"
- R relationships presences of friends, family, social connections
- M meaning belonging to something bigger than one's self
- A accomplishment pursue something even if it brings no positive emotions
- Focus is on human flourishing, individualistic and psychological

2015 UN Sustainable Development Goals

- A world where people, communities and creation can flourish
- Some of the goals:
- No poverty or hunger, good health and well-being, quality education, clean water and sanitation, clean affordable energy, decent work and economic growth, innovation and infrastructure, sustainable cities and communities, responsible production and consumption
- Work on climate change, supporting life below sea and on land
- Peace, justice, partnerships for these goals

Flourish – parach


- Bud, blossom, break forth, sprout,
- About growth, life and thriving
- Often connected to righteous people/righteousness in the psalms
- When righteousness is not legal or economic, can be creational
- Be what you are created to be:
- Vocation of all humans: till and keep the soil
- Till serve
- Keep guard

Bible

- Gives vision and means for flourishing
- Salvation in Jesus Christ, gift of the Holy Spirit
- God is the source of all flourishing; not human effort
- God's intent for creation is shalom/wholeness/thriving/flourishing, what life is meant to be
- Biblical flourishing is holistic, not just economic, not just individualistic, not just happiness. Involves people, communities and land

Chapters 36-39 – Historical account of the history of Sennacherib's attack in 701 as part of God's care and protection as theme of 1st and 2nd Isaiah


Following many scholars, I see Isaiah 35 as part of 2nd Isaiah, edited into a bridge position of lst Isaiah

Socio-historical Context – Babylonian Exile, Exile

- #PandemicPastoring by Eileen Campbell-Reid (Pastoral Imagination)
- Loss of place –virtual worship
- How to rebuild routines and connections to fit new realities
- Pervasive anxiety, fear and "scarcity" in the system
- Need to attend to grief, lament what is lost and passing away
- Need to begin singing a new song, a new story, filled with future possibilities for how to be beloved community. There is a future

Historical context – end of Babylonian exile

- Babylonian Exile
- Fall of Jerusalem
- Fall of the House of David
- Destruction of Temple
- 10-15% population deported to Babylon
- Cyrus the Persian now on the scene



Theological context

- Why did God allow this to happen?
- Is Marduk stronger than the Lord?
- Does God care?
- Does God have the power to make a difference?



Exile - process

- Initial trauma
- Long duration
- Acclimation inertia. If life isn't too bad, the known present can be more comfortable and secure than the promises of a glorious future

Prophetic imagination

- A community defeated by war, removed by oppressive power, experiencing desolation and dislocation, then inertia...
- Call to create a new vision, a reminder that the order of things as they are not are not as God intends them to be and can be overcome by God's creative power.
- Promise not just the end of exile, but a redemptive reversal coming of God that makes the people whole, a new creation as well as human salvation. All creation is restored.



Isaiah 35.1-2

• The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God.





Nature rejoicing, singing, joy



- Exalt, delight, be bright,
- Excitement
- Lifting of the heart
- Often God rejoicing in the people of God
- How do you feel to know that God rejoices in you?

Isaiah 35.3-4

- Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees.
 Say to those who are of a fearful heart, "Be strong, do not fear!
 Here is your God. God will come with vengeance (vindication), with recompense. God will come and save you."
- Change world view; inertia mission and identity
- Vengeance depends on location, God righting wrongs, a redress of negative circumstances, ordering chaos
- Recompense dealing, benefit

Isaiah 35.5-7



 Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. For waters shall break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert; the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water; the haunt of jackals shall become a swamp, the grass shall become reeds and rushes.

Transformational power of God's presence

Both human and nonhuman creation transformed


Isaiah 6.9-10 — spiritual blindness and deafness — God's judgment now overcome with grace

Life giving and overabundance of waters





Isaiah 35.8-9



 A highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Holy Way; the unclean shall not travel on it, but it shall be for God's people; no traveler, not even fools, shall go astray. No lion shall be there, nor shall any ravenous beast come up on it; they shall not be found there, but the redeemed shall walk there.

Travelers on the Holy Way – God prepares the way, not us



- Holy way new exodus, direct line home, pilgrimage way to Zion
- Unclean made clean!!
- Fools morally "directionally challenged"
- Redeemed theme used mainly in 2nd and 3rd Isaiah; Lord as Israel's redeemer, kinship idea, identity
- Safety and security emphasized

Isaiah 35.10

- And the ransomed of the Lord shall return, and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.
- Ransomed Exodus, exile
- Joy gladness, mirth, festivity
- Flee take flight, disappear



Thoughts and reflections

- Transformations of human and nonhuman creation
- Call for the community to participate they have an identity as the people of God and a mission to support one another and proclaim the Good News. This is really good news.
- Inertia new story and new song to share and live
- There is a future hope despite our present reality, grounded in God.
